




**Historical Population Counts:
1980-2000**

Population increased 11% from 245 in 1990 to 272 in 2000. The median age remained constant at 23 years.




**Population by Selected Age Groups

Youth are the fastest growing segment of the population in the last decade.




Utah Population by Race: 2000

Census 2000 indicates that American Indian and Alaska Native made up 1.33% of the Utah population. Those selecting the "Some Other Race" category were primarily of Hispanic/Latino descent.




Employment (non-agricultural) by Major Industry

Class of Worker


Government workers, which make up the majority of employment, includes all public-sector services, including schools, fire departments, and


**Job Growth Rate: 1970-2000
Utah vs. Nation**

Since 1970, Utah has consistently outpaced the U.S. in the amount of job growth. Meaningful data on job growth for Reservations is not available.




**Unemployment: 1980-2002

The percentage of those 16 years and older in the labor force remained rose from 1990 to 2000, dropping the unemployment rate.




**Median Household Income: 1989 & 1999

Utah vs. Reservation**


Per capita increased in the last decade.



Note: 1989 income values have been adjusted to 1999 constant dollars by dividing 1989 dollar values by a deflator factor of 0.744298


**Population in Poverty

The percentage of families below the poverty level increased in the last decade.




Educational Attainment: 1990* Utah vs. Reservation

The percentage of those 25 years and older with high school diploma or higher increased from 39% in 1990 to 54% in 2000, but remained lower than the state average.
